

# Welcome to the Musée des Augustins

The Musée des Augustins is Toulouse's fine arts museum. It is an imposing feature of the present-day cityscape, just as it was in the past: characteristic of the local urban architecture, the former Augustinian Convent of Toulouse, built in the 14th century, is ideally located in the city centre. The large cloister and garden offer visitors a unique atmosphere.

The collections include outstanding medieval sculptures, a number of very large-scale 17th and 18th century paintings from Toulouse or further afield, and a remarkable set of 19th century paintings and sculptures.

Modern art is not overlooked, one striking example being the flamboyant installation by Jorge Pardo which you'll discover in the Roman room. New works, designed especially for the museum, have been woven into the itinerary, shaping a dialogue with the place and its collections, giving the history-laden venue a poetic new twist.

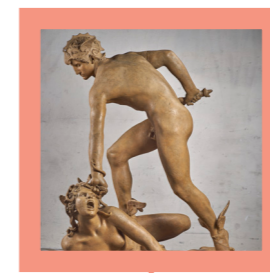
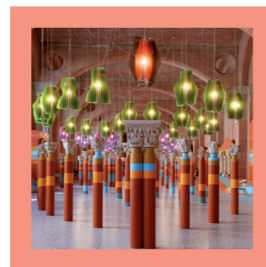
